GRADING AT THE UNIVERSITE DE STRASBOURG

- Grading is done on a scale from 0 (minimum) to 20 (maximum).
- Commonly a paper or an exam will be graded, for instance, 12/20; which means 12 out of a possible maximum of 20.
- 10/20 is the pass grade. Anything below is considered to be a fail grade.
- However it is not uncommon for good students to have one or several fail grades on their grade sheets since averaging of all grades in our yearly system means that a student can compensate one or several fail grades by good grades elsewhere in other subject matters and achieve overall success.
- This feature means that professors do not hesitate to give grades below 10/20 considering that students have various opportunities to catch up elsewhere.
- Grades of 20/20 are never given
- 17/20, 18/20 or 19/20 are very very exceptional.
- For all purposes 16/20 tends to be the top of the scale.
- The great bulk of grades is commonly between 8/20 and 12/20.
- So any grade between 12/20 and 16/20 is good.
- 8/20 and 9/20, even though they are fail grades, can be considered as a « performance that meets the minimum criteria ».
- anything below 8/20 can be deemed insufficient.
